### **Annual Water Quality Report Now Available**

OMWD is proud to share our water quality data with you each year in a detailed report, in compliance with state and federal law. We continually meet or exceed all state and federal water quality standards for your drinking water.

2019's Sierra snowpack is three times the amount it was last year. Snowpack makes up about 30 percent of water storage in California and gradually replenishes reservoirs as it melts.

Storms have also replenished California's reservoirs, with many above historical averages and some at over 90 percent of capacity. Full reservoirs and adequate snowpack have nearly erased statewide drought conditions, but prudent water managers must also look ahead to build

### resilience for the future.

OMWD encourages continued water use efficiency to ensure adequate water supplies in the region. To reduce demand for potable water, OMWD remains committed to expanding its recycled water system. Additionally, OMWD continues to study the feasibility of brackish groundwater desalination and installed in April a test well in the San Dieguito Valley. # **Reduce Summer Use to Save On Water Bills**

As we head into warmer months, water bills tend to increase as we run irrigation systems longer, refill the pool, or invite guests from out of town to stay during the summer. Outdoor water use accounts for up to 80 percent of a typical customer's summer water usage. Residents can find tips to mitigate some of these increases at www.olivenhain.com/resources, and below are a few ways to save water and money as temperatures rise:

 Free water use evaluations – OMWD encourages customers to utilize our free water use evaluation service to answer your questions on monitoring monthly water usage, programming your irrigation timer, using your water meter to check for leaks, or making your landscape water-smart. - 2) Rebates on water-saving devices Consider upgrading your irrigation system with highefficient, stream rotating nozzles and a smart irrigation controller that adjusts your schedule automatically for weather conditions. Rebates are available at www.socalwatersmart.com.
- 3) Turf Replacement Incentive If the only time you step on your lawn is to mow it, consider taking advantage of Metropolitan Water District's Turf Replacement Program. The incentive has increased to \$2 per square foot removed, and program requirements have been simplified. To learn more, visit www.socalwatersmart.com.

### **Prevent Backups by Keeping Non-Flushable Items out of the Toilet**

When toilets are misused as trashcans, unfortunate consequences can occur including backups in your plumbing or problems at your local reclamation facility. To prevent these problems from occurring, avoid flushing items such as baby wipes and diapers, rags and towels, wrappers, sponges, plastic items, aquarium gravel, kitty litter, latex gloves, cigarette butts, sanitary napkins, hair, or "disposable" toilet brushes.

In addition, whatever ends up in your toilet can potentially have an impact on the water environment in your community, so it is critical to keep household wastes such as chemicals and pharmaceutical products out of your toilet. Visit www.nodrugsdownthedrain.org to find local disposal sites.
